If you have a child attending George Bonner Elementary who is in Grade 4 or 7 you will receive an e-mail this week with instructions on how to complete the survey.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at

Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school.

The e-survey site will be open **until** May 2nd, 2025. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Parking Lot



Both staff and parents have expressed concern regarding student drop off and pick up times at the start and end of the day. In order to ensure student safety please obey the following general rules:

- Please do not block the parking lot by stopping for too long as your child(ren) get out or into the vehicle.
- Please have them exit on the non-traffic side of the vehicle so they are not stepping out into traffic
- When dropping off in the parking lot area, please wait to drop off the children closest to the school so cars behind you are not tempted to pass while children are exiting the car
- Keep traffic moving through the parking lot.
- Please do not park close to the entry gates as it is difficult for busses to get by.

A reminder to please send an extra set of




clothing in your child's backpack. Fields are wet and mucky this time of year and students often come in from playtime needing dry clothes.


